Last August, the Jackson County Public Library Food for Fines programs netted these fines waived and items donated to the local food banks:

Seymour - \$1,116.08 fines waived and 1,149 items donated Crothersville - \$669.95 fines waived and 699 items donated Medora - \$340.20 fines waived and 361 items donated Total - \$2,156.23 fines waived and 2,209 food items donated

The items are divided and taken to Human Services, Anchor House and Provisions. These food banks are very low on supplies of food for hungry individuals in our county.

Please donate food and waive fines. You can even do this for someone else. Then he or she can perhaps check out things from the library while others can eat!

Bring any non-perishable food donation to any Jackson County Public Library location.

1 non-perishable food item equals \$1 or less in overdue charges forgiven.

Library cardholders with collection agency accounts may participate after paying the \$10 collection agency account fee. All materials must be returned before the fines can be waived.



Nathan is stuck between black witches and white witches. He has an

indomitable will to survive, coupled with the ability to heal quickly. There are some pretty awful scenes of brutality that are well written and don't feel gratuitous. Some of the characters are pretty interesting, especially the fascinating Celia. Readers want to learn about the motivations behind these characters' behaviors and will want to finish this book. They will HATE waiting for the next installment.

This book has its pros and cons. On the negative side, it is written in first person with short, choppy sentences, and the story is a bit slow. On the positive side, it's a good story and this is part of a series where this second book may be more enjoyable than the first.



The Fault in Our Stars
BY JOHN GREEN

The relationship between Hazel and Augustus, two young people forced

into adulthood before their time, is precious and poignant. The emotions they express are raw, real and easily recognizable by anyone who has cancer or has been close to someone with cancer. It's unapologetic in its honesty, difficult to read and impossible to put down. It is in the same vein as Jodi Piccoult's My Sister's Keeper and Nicolas Sparks' A Walk to Remember.
