Two kids gave us their reasons for reading. Erin Otte, age 11, thinks the reason she likes to read is that “it gives you something to do and when you start to read a book you will just want to keep reading and reading. And when you are done you find out that it is a really good book.”

Chanel Martinez, age 11, enjoys reading because, “You can learn almost anything by reading books. I like mysteries the best.”

Several adult and teen book discussion groups are open for new members or people who just visit from time to time. Please look at the program pages of this issue to find the details of the groups at each library. Also, there will be giveaways of *The Great Gatsby* book by F. Scott Fitzgerald this summer in the discussion groups and at other programs. You will find a 1920’s program about life in Jackson County in the program pages, too.

Also, when I am reading about a place and it is described in detail and then I find out from people who have traveled there that the detail is true to the actual location, I feel like I am there.”

Mary Lou Schollenberger explains, “I really enjoy geography and history. I travel a lot. When I am reading a book about places I have been, I feel like I am there with the characters. We all have life experiences—and if I can associate with a character because I have had those same experiences, that really puts me in the story with that character. I have always enjoyed reading. It is a wonderful past time.”

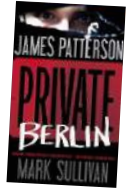

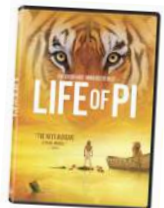
