

The Jackson County Public Library's *Build a Better World* summer reading program is June 1-July 31 at the Seymour, Crothersville and Medora libraries and on the Discovery Bus. The summer reading program is free and open to all ages, newborn through adult.

Participants set their own goals of how much to read for themselves and/or their children from the options provided. Reached goals can then be marked on the calendar included with sign-up information.

Each week, in order to help participants reach their goals, the library will give away a book. The book choices will be age appropriate for young readers, mid-grade readers, young adults, and adults.

Additionally the library will have grand prizes available. New this year is the ability for all ages to try to win any prize chosen from the list provided.

Attending programs
Completing BUILD card activities

BUILD (Bingo) cards allow participants to complete additional literacy activities.

SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM






The Library will participate in the Summer Lunch Program at Mountain Baptist Church on U.S. 31 near Sycamore Springs and Pebblebrook.

Stories Buildings Tell


Friday, 6/23, 5:45-7 pm


Laura Renwick, Community Preservation Specialist from Indiana Landmarks, will speak about how details in buildings can reveal the past and tell stories of the people who occupied them.


Genealogy Lock-In Friday, 6/23, 7-10 pm


Following the speaker, participants *may* choose to stay for an after-hours lock-in to do genealogy research.




