Laura Renwick, Community Preservation Specialist from Indiana Landmarks, will speak about how details in buildings can reveal the past and tell stories of the people who occupied them.

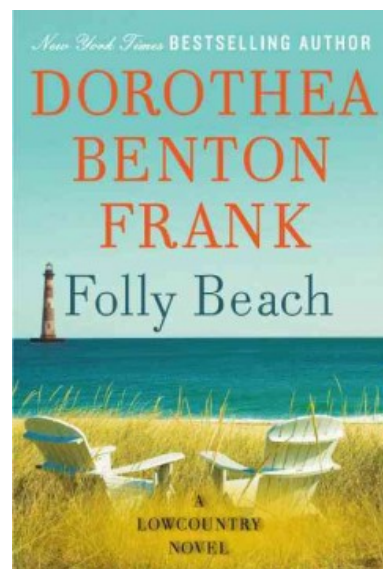
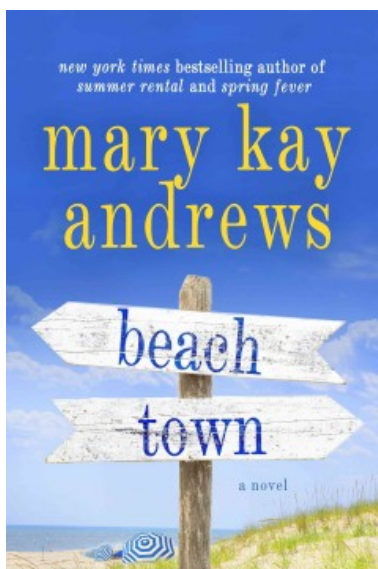
