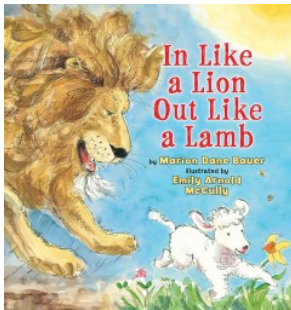

Check out a Bike Lock at the Library

All Jackson County Public Library locations now have bike locks for customers to check out. Locks may be checked out daily for the duration of the user's library visit and are due back 15 minutes before the library closes. Locks are available on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be

reserved in advance. To check out a lock, it is preferred that a user show a library card or photo ID. If a user has neither a library card or a photo ID, the user's photograph will be taken at the Checkout Desk. All users checking out bike locks must also fill out an equipment form. Users will be issued 1 key to secure the lock. If the lock and key are not returned by closing, the user will be charged a fine of \$2.00 per day until both the lock and key are returned or a maximum \$20.00. If a key is lost, the user will be charged \$15.00, and if a lock is lost, the user will be charged \$25.00. Locks must be returned to the Checkout Desk, and not in the materials return.



VITA Free Tax Service

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) offers free tax help to low- to moderate-income (generally, \$54,000 and below) people who cannot prepare their own tax returns. Certified volunteers sponsored by various organizations receive IRS training to help prepare basic tax returns in communities across the county. Please call 2-1-1 or 812-376-6666, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, to make an appointment to have your taxes done for free by the VITA tax volunteers at the Library.

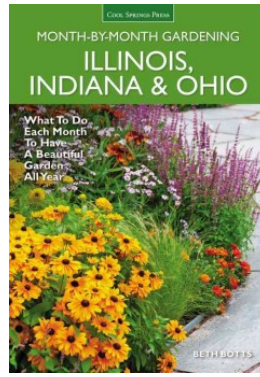
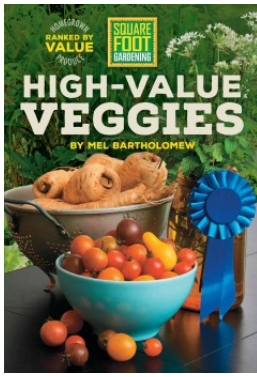


Science Fun With Purdue Extension
