

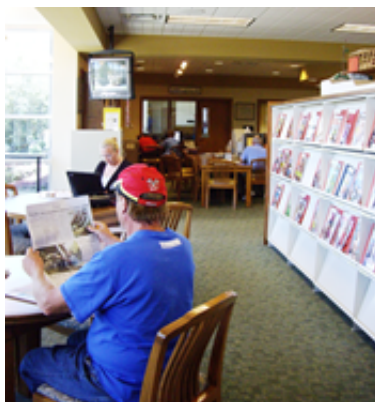
## Libraries Warm Up the Winter...
