






Can you guess who the child in the picture above is? A hint: she was an important political figure in the 20th Century. The answer is at the end of the Browse.

Benjamin Harrison: An Indiana President

President Benjamin Harrison first moved to Indiana with his wife Caroline in 1854 when he began practicing law. He served in the Civil War, and afterwards he held a number of political positions before being elected President in 1888. He served as President from 1889-1893. Benjamin Harrison died in 1901 and is buried in Indianapolis. To learn more about Benjamin Harrison, visit the Library to check out the following resources:









VITA Free Tax Service

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) offers free tax help to low- to moderate-income (generally, \$54,000 and below) people who cannot prepare their own tax returns. Certified volunteers sponsored by various organizations receive IRS training to help prepare basic tax returns in communities across the county. Please call 2-1-1 or 812-376-6666, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, to make an appointment to have your taxes done for free by the VITA tax volunteers at the Library.



Indiana State Parks Pass

The Seymour Library has one free Indiana State Parks Pass to check out to patrons. The pass is available on a first-come, first-served basis, and patrons may not place a hold on it. To check if the pass is available and to check it out, please ask at the Seymour Library Checkout Desk.

Toyota will bring their Mobile Maufacturing Experience back to the Seymour Library! The event takes place on Wednesday, March 8, 1-7 pm and is open to grades 6 – adult.

The lab was created for training purposes at the plant but the creators soon realized the outreach and recruitment potential the stations held and the Mobile Manufacturing Experience was born.

Participants can test their painting skills, learn how to weld, compete against others in precision peg flipping, and more. Toyota employees will also be on hand with educational information about manufacturing and to answer questions.
