# WELCOME JAMI CAFFEE YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAM ASSISTANT


Jami started her job as a Youth Services Program Assistant on March 20. Jami is from Brownstown. She enjoys visiting State Parks, traveling, and hiking.

Friday, 4/21, all day **National Poem in Your Pocket Day**Select a poem from our jar, carry it with you, and share it with others. While supplies last.


